## Results

- Index is $\mathbf{5 5 . 0}$ out of $\mathbf{1 0 0}$. This is better than "normal." A reading of 50 is supposed to be about normal.
- This is a record high for the index! This is just the second time that the sentiment index topped 50 .
- There were 13 Acadiana business leaders surveyed. The survey was conducted online in March 2012.

The responses to the first 10 questions are used to calculate the Business Sentiment Index...

## First 10 questions make up the Business Sentiment Index.

- 0-to-100 scale.
- 100 = high level of economic activity (boom)
$-0=$ the economy goes bust!
- 50 is a "typical" reading...If all possible responses are evenly distributed among the choices, you will get a reading of 50 .
- A 50 is normal.
- The points are based on the percent of responses to a particular question choice.
- The index was 54.98 in Q4 2011, which is up from 53.77 in Q3 2011.
