Mouton while others represented UL Lafayette at national sales competitions. Additionally, many students gained experience through internships and class projects, like the college's portfolio management course where they manage a stock portfolio for the UL Lafayette Foundation.





Moody College of Business students, faculty and staff enjoyed a field trip to the Port of New Orleans and World Trade Center of New Orleans in October. The trip included a private boat tour and presentations by representatives from WTCNO, Coastal Cargo, New Orleans Public Belt Railroad, and Canal Barge Company.

New scholarships were awarded to hospitality management students during the Fall 2016 semester. Honors freshman Jenna Allen from Youngsville, La., and sophomore Leah Williamson from Marrero, La., were granted scholarships from the Louisiana Restaurant Association Education Foundation totaling \$2,900. This is the first time the LRA scholarship has been granted to any UL Lafayette students. Blade Armentor from Sunset, La., is the recipient of the new \$1,000 Ruth Fertel scholarship in hospitality management.



Three College of Business faculty members received Research Recognition Awards in November. Dr. Ram Thakur was granted a Research Excellence Award.
